Mr. Graham of South Carolina (for himself and Mr. Cornyn) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

To provide for enhanced criminal penalties for crimes related to slavery and alien smuggling.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Human Trafficking
- 5 and Smuggling Penalty Enhancement Act of 2004".
- 6 SEC. 2. ENHANCED PENALTIES FOR SLAVERY AND ALIEN
- 7 **SMUGGLING.**
- 8 (a) Death Resulting From Slavery.—Chapter
- 9 77 of title 18, United States Code, is amended—

1	(1) in section 1581(a), by striking "or if" and
2	inserting "the defendant shall be fined under this
3	title, punished by death or imprisonment for any
4	term of years or for life, or both. If";
5	(2) in section 1583, by striking "or if" and in-
6	serting "the defendant shall be fined under this title,
7	punished by death or imprisonment for any term of
8	years or for life, or both. If";
9	(3) in section 1584, by striking "or if" and in-
10	serting "the defendant shall be fined under this title,
11	punished by death or imprisonment for any term of
12	years or for life, or both. If";
13	(4) in section 1589, by striking "or if" and in-
14	serting "the defendant shall be fined under this title,
15	punished by death or imprisonment for any term of
16	years or for life, or both. If";
17	(5) in section 1590, by striking "or if" and in-
18	serting "the defendant shall be fined under this title,
19	punished by death or imprisonment for any term of
20	years or for life, or both. If"; and
21	(6) in section 1591(b)—
22	(A) by redesignating paragraphs (1) and
23	(2) as paragraphs (2) and (3), respectively; and

1	(B) by inserting before paragraph (2), as
2	redesignated by subparagraph (A), the fol-
3	lowing:
4	"(1) if the offense resulted in the death of the
5	victim, a fine under this title, death or imprisonment
6	for any term of years or for life, or both;".
7	(b) ALIEN SMUGGLING.—Section 274(a) of the Im-
8	migration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1324(a)) is
9	amended—
10	(1) in paragraph (1)—
11	(A) in subparagraph (A)—
12	(i) by amending clause (i) to read as
13	follows:
14	"(i) knowing or in reckless disregard of the fact
15	that a person is an alien, brings or attempts to bring
16	to the United States in any manner whatsoever such
17	person at a place other than a designated port of
18	entry or a place designated by the Under Secretary
19	for Border and Transportation Security, regardless
20	of—
21	"(I) whether such alien has received prior
22	official authorization to come to, enter, or re-
23	side in the United States:

1	"(II) whether the person bringing or at-
2	tempting to bring such alien to the United
3	States intended to violate any criminal law; or
4	"(III) any future official action which may
5	be taken with respect to such alien;";
6	(ii) in clause (iv), by striking "or" at
7	the end;
8	(iii) in clause (v)—
9	(I) in subclause (I), by striking
10	", or" and inserting a semicolon;
11	(II) in subclause (II), by striking
12	the comma and inserting "; or"; and
13	(III) by inserting after subclause
14	(II) the following:
15	"(III) attempts to commit any of the preceding
16	acts; or'; and
17	(iv) by inserting after clause (v) the
18	following:
19	"(vi) knowing or in reckless disregard of the
20	fact that a person is an alien, causes or attempts to
21	cause such alien to be transported or moved across
22	an international boundary, knowing that such trans-
23	portation or moving is part of such alien's effort to
24	enter or attempt to enter the United States without
25	prior official authorization,"; and

1	(B) in subparagraph (B)—
2	(i) in clause (i)—
3	(I) by striking "subparagraph
4	(A)(i) or (v)(I)" and inserting "clause
5	(i), (v)(I), or (vi) of subparagraph
6	(A)"; and
7	(II) by striking "10 years" and
8	inserting "20 years";
9	(ii) in clause (ii)—
10	(I) by striking "subparagraph
11	(A) (ii), (iii), (iv), or $(v)(\Pi)$ " and in-
12	serting "clause (ii), (iii), (iv), or
13	(v)(II) of subparagraph (A)"; and
14	(II) by striking "5 years" and in-
15	serting "10 years"; and
16	(iii) in clause (iii)—
17	(I) by striking "subparagraph
18	(A) (i), (ii), (iii), (iv), or (v)" and in-
19	serting "subparagraph (A)"; and
20	(II) by striking "20 years" and
21	inserting "35 years";
22	(2) in paragraph (2)—
23	(A) in the matter preceding subparagraph
24	(A)—

1	(i) by inserting ", or facilitates or at-
2	tempts to facilitate the bringing or trans-
3	porting," after "attempts to bring"; and
4	(ii) by inserting "and regardless of
5	whether the person bringing or attempting
6	to bring such alien to the United States in-
7	tended to violate any criminal law," after
8	"with respect to such alien"; and
9	(B) in subparagraph (B)—
10	(i) in clause (i), by striking the
11	comma at the end and inserting a semi-
12	colon;
13	(ii) in clause (ii), by striking ", or"
14	and inserting a semicolon;
15	(iii) in clause (iii), by striking the
16	comma at the end and inserting "; or";
17	(iv) by inserting after clause (iii), the
18	following:
19	"(iv) an offense committed with knowledge
20	or reason to believe that the alien unlawfully
21	brought to or into the United States has en-
22	gaged in or intends to engage in terrorist activ-
23	ity (as defined in section 212(a)(3)(B)(iv)),";
24	and

1	(v) in the matter following clause (iv),
2	as added by this subparagraph, by striking
3	"3 nor more than 10 years" and inserting
4	"5 years and not more than 20 years";
5	and
6	(3) in paragraph (3)(A), by striking "5 years"
7	and inserting "10 years".
8	SEC. 3. AMENDMENT TO SENTENCING GUIDELINES RELAT-
9	ING TO ALIEN SMUGGLING OFFENSES.
10	(a) DIRECTIVE TO UNITED STATES SENTENCING
11	COMMISSION.—Pursuant to its authority under section
12	994(p) of title 18, United States Code, and in accordance
13	with this section, the United States Sentencing Commis-
14	sion shall review and, as appropriate, amend the Federal
15	Sentencing Guidelines and related policy statements to im-
16	plement the provisions of this Act.
17	(b) Requirements.—In carrying out this section,
18	the United States Sentencing Commission shall—
19	(1) ensure that the Sentencing Guidelines and
20	Policy Statements reflect—
21	(A) the serious nature of the offenses and
22	penalties referred to in this Act;
23	(B) the growing incidence of alien smug-
24	gling offenses; and

1	(C) the need to deter, prevent, and punish
2	such offenses;
3	(2) consider the extent to which the Sentencing
4	Guidelines and Policy Statements adequately ad-
5	dress whether the guideline offense levels and en-
6	hancements for violations of the sections amended
7	by this Act—
8	(A) sufficiently deter and punish such of-
9	fenses; and
10	(B) adequately reflect the enhanced pen-
11	alties established under this Act;
12	(3) maintain reasonable consistency with other
13	relevant directives and sentencing guidelines;
14	(4) account for any additional aggravating or
15	mitigating circumstances that might justify excep-
16	tions to the generally applicable sentencing ranges;
17	(5) make any necessary conforming changes to
18	the Sentencing Guidelines; and
19	(6) ensure that the Sentencing Guidelines ade-
20	quately meet the purposes of sentencing under sec-
21	tion 3553(a)(2) of title 18, United States Code.
