A BILL

To direct the Secretary of the Interior to study the suitability and feasibility of designating the Wolf House, located in Norfolk, Arkansas, as a unit of the National Park System, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Wolf House Study Act
- 5 of 2004".

SEC. 2. FINDINGS.

- 2 Congress finds that the Wolf House, located in Nor-
- 3 folk, Arkansas, is the oldest 2-story log structure and the
- 4 oldest territorial courthouse west of the Mississippi River.
- 5 SEC. 3. DEFINITIONS.
- 6 In this Act:
- 7 (1) House.—The term "Wolf House" means
- 8 the structure known by that name located on High-
- 9 way 5 in Norfolk, Arkansas.
- 10 (2) Secretary.—The term "Secretary" means
- the Secretary of the Interior, acting through the Di-
- rector of the National Park Service.
- 13 SEC. 4. WOLF HOUSE STUDY.
- 14 (a) In General.—The Secretary, in consultation
- 15 with the State of Arkansas, shall—
- 16 (1) carry out a study on the suitability and fea-
- sibility of designating the Wolf House as a unit of
- the National Park System; and
- 19 (2) consider management alternatives for the
- Wolf House.
- 21 (b) APPLICABLE LAW.—Except as provided by sub-
- 22 section (c), section 8(c) of Public Law 91–383 (16 U.S.C.
- 23 1a-5(c)) shall apply to the conduct and completion of the
- 24 study required by subsection (a).
- 25 (c) Report.—Not later than 1 year after the date
- 26 of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall submit

- 1 to the Committee on Resources of the House of Represent-
- 2 atives and the Committee on Energy and Natural Re-
- 3 sources of the Senate a report describing the results of

4 the study.
