Mr. LIEBERMAN (for himself and Mr. DASCHLE) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Governmental Affairs

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## A BILL

To strike certain provisions of the Homeland Security Act of 2002 (Public Law 107–296), and for other purposes.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. AMENDMENTS TO THE HOMELAND SECURITY**

4               **ACT OF 2002.**

5               (a) STRICKEN PROVISIONS.—

6                       (1) IN GENERAL.—The Homeland Security Act  
7               of 2002 (Public Law 107–296) is amended—

8                               (A) in section 308(b)(2) by striking sub-  
9               paragraph (B) and inserting the following:

“(B) CRITERIA FOR SELECTION.—In selecting colleges or universities as centers for homeland security, the Secretary shall consider demonstrated expertise in interdisciplinary public policy research and communication outreach regarding science, technology, and public policy.”;

(B) in section 311—

(i) by striking subsection (i); and

(ii) redesignating subsection (j) as subsection (i);

(C) in title VIII, by striking subtitle G;

(D) by striking section 871;

(E) by striking section 890;

(F) by striking section 1707; and

(G) by striking sections 1714, 1715, 1716, and 1717.

(2) TECHNICAL AND CONFORMING AMENDMENTS.—The table of contents for the Homeland Security Act of 2002 (Public Law 107–296) is amended by striking the items relating to subtitle G of title VIII, and sections 871, 890, 1707, 1714, 1715, 1716, and 1717.

(b) ADVISORY GROUPS.—Section 232(b) of the Homeland Security Act of 2002 (Public Law 107–296)

1 is amended by striking paragraph (2) and inserting the  
2 following:

3           “(2) To establish and maintain advisory groups  
4       to assess the law enforcement technology needs of  
5       Federal, State, and local law enforcement agencies.”.

6       (c) WAIVERS RELATING TO CONTRACTS WITH COR-  
7 PORATE EXPATRIATES.—Section 835 of the Homeland  
8 Security Act of 2002 (Public Law 107–296) is amended  
9 by striking subsection (d) and inserting the following:

10       “(d) WAIVERS.—The Secretary shall waive sub-  
11 section (a) with respect to any specific contract if the Sec-  
12 retary determines that the waiver is required in the inter-  
13 est of homeland security.”.

14       (d) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by  
15 this Act shall take effect as though enacted as part of the  
16 Homeland Security Act of 2002 (Public Law 107–296).

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
