A BILL

To direct the Secretary of the Army to convey the remaining water supply storage allocation in Rathbun Lake, Iowa, to the Rathbun Regional Water Association.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. RATHBUN LAKE, IOWA.
- 4 (a) Conveyance.—The Secretary of the Army shall
- 5 convey the remaining water supply storage allocation in
- 6 Rathbun Lake, Iowa, to the Rathbun Regional Water As-
- 7 sociation (referred to in this section as the "Water Asso-
- 8 ciation").

1	(b) Construction of Visitor Center Com-
2	PLEX.—Notwithstanding the Water Supply Act of 1958
3	(43 U.S.C. 390b), in exchange for the water supply stor-
4	age allocation to be conveyed under subsection (a), the
5	Water Association shall construct, in accordance with sub-
6	section (c), a regional lighthouse visitor center complex on
7	Federal land at Rathbun Lake.
8	(c) Terms and Conditions.—Before conveying the
9	water supply storage allocation under subsection (a), the
10	Secretary of the Army shall enter into an agreement with
11	the Water Association under which the Water Association
12	shall agree—
13	(1) in accordance with designs approved by the
14	Chief of Engineers, to construct a visitor center
15	complex that has a value equal to or greater than
16	the amount that otherwise would be paid to the Fed-
17	eral Government for the costs of the water supply
18	storage under the Water Supply Act of 1958 (43
19	U.S.C. 390b);
20	(2) to be responsible for operating and main-
21	taining the visitor center complex;
22	(3) to pay all operation and maintenance costs
23	allocated to the water supply storage space;
24	(4) to use any revenues generated at the visitor
25	center complex that are in excess of the revenues re-

quired to operate and maintain or improve the complex to undertake, subject to the approval of the Chief of Engineers, activities that will improve the quality of the environment in the Rathbun Lake watershed area; and

(5) to such other terms and conditions as the Secretary considers necessary to protect the interests of the United States.
