A BILL

To amend title 18, United States Code, to exempt certain rocket propellants from prohibitions under that title on explosive materials.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1	SECTION 1. EXEMPTION OF CERTAIN ROCKET PROPEL-
2	LANTS FROM CRIMINAL PROHIBITIONS ON
3	EXPLOSIVE MATERIALS.
4	(a) Non-Detonable Rocket Propellant De-
5	FINED.—Section 841 of title 18, United States Code, is
6	amended by adding at the end the following:
7	"(t) 'Non-detonable rocket propellant' means
8	any material, chemical, or chemical mixture con-
9	sisting of fuel and oxidizer that provides thrust to a
10	rocket, or generates hot, high pressure gas for doing
11	work in the actuation of various power or mechan-
12	ical devices, and is classified as a non-explosive by
13	the Department of Transportation or classified by
14	the Department of Transportation as a Class 1.3
15	Explosive or lower.".
16	(b) Exemption. Section 845(a) of that title is
17	amended—
18	(1) in paragraph (5), by striking "and" at the
19	end;
20	(2) in paragraph (6), by striking the period at
21	the end and inserting "; and"; and
22	(3) by adding at the end the following new
23	paragraph:
24	"(7) commercially manufactured black powder
25	in quantities not to exceed two pounds, safety and
26	pyrotechnic fuses, quick and slow matches, electric

1	matches, igniters, or non-detonable rocket propellant
2	intended to be used in rockets that do not earry
3	any
4	"(A) explosive, incendiary, or poison gas;
5	"(B) bomb;
6	"(C) grenade;
7	"(D) explosive or incendiary charge of
8	more than three-quarter ounce;
9	"(E) mine; or
10	"(F) device similar to any device referred
11	to in subparagraphs (A) through (E).".
12	(e) Effective Date.—(1) Subject to paragraph (2),
13	the amendments made by this section shall take effect on
14	the date of the enactment of this Act.
15	(2) If the date of the enactment of this section is less
16	than 180 days after the date of the enactment of the
17	Homeland Security Act of 2002 (Public Law 107–296),
18	the amendments made by this section shall take effect im-
19	mediately after the entry into effect of the amendments
20	made by section 1122 of that Act (116 Stat. 2280) pursu-
21	ant to subsection (i) of such section 1122 (116 Stat.
22	2283).

1	SECTION 1. EXEMPTION OF APCP USED AS MODEL ROCKET
2	FUEL FROM CRIMINAL PROHIBITIONS ON EX-
3	PLOSIVE MATERIALS.
4	(a) In General.—Section 845(a) of title 18, United
5	States Code, is amended—
6	(1) in paragraph (5), by striking "and" at the
7	end;
8	(2) in paragraph (6), by striking the period at
9	the end and inserting "; and"; and
10	(3) by adding at the end the following new para-
11	graph:
12	"(7) commercially manufactured black powder
13	in quantities not to exceed 2 pounds, safety and pyro-
14	technic fuses, quick and slow matches, electric
15	matches, igniters, or model rocket motors containing
16	no more than .9 pounds of ammonium perchlorate
17	composite propellant intended to be used in rockets
18	that do not carry any—
19	"(A) explosive, incendiary, or poison gas;
20	"(B) bomb;
21	"(C) grenade;
22	"(D) explosive or incendiary charge of more
23	than three-quarter ounce;
24	"(E) mine; or
25	"(F) device similar to any device referred to
26	in subparagraphs (A) through (E).".

1 (b) Exemption Relating to Storage.—Section
2 842(j) of title 18, United States Code, is amended by—
3 (1) inserting "(1)" after "(j)"; and
4 (2) adding at the end the following:
5 "(2) Notwithstanding paragraph (1), a person who
6 possesses ammonium perchlorate composite propellants for
7 purposes of powering recreational model rockets may possess and store quantities not to exceed 25 pounds of such
9 propellants.".
