Mr. GREGG (for himself and Mr. FEINGOLD) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred jointly pursuant to the order of August 4, 1977, to the Committees on the Budget and Governmental Affairs, with instructions that if one committee reports, the other committee have thirty days to report or be discharged

A BILL

To extend certain budgetary enforcement to maintain fiscal accountability and responsibility.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. EXTENSION OF PAY-AS-YOU-GO REQUIREMENT.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 252 of the Balanced
5 Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985 (2
6 U.S.C. 902) is amended—

7 (1) in subsections (a) and (b)(1), by striking
8 “enacted before October 1, 2002,” and inserting
9 “enacted before October 1, 2007”; and

1 (2) in subsection (b), by inserting at the end
2 thereof the following:

3 “(3) EXCEPTION.—Notwithstanding any other
4 provision of law, there shall be no sequestration
5 under this section for any fiscal year in which a sur-
6 plus exists (as measured in conformance with section
7 13301 of the Budget Enforcement Act of 1990).”.

8 (b) ENFORCEMENT.—The second sentence of section
9 275(b) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit
10 Control Act of 1985 (2 U.S.C. 900 note) is amended by
11 striking “2006” and inserting “2007”.

12 SEC. 2. EXTENSION OF BUDGET POINTS OF ORDER AND
13 RULES IN THE SENATE.

14 (a) EXTENSION OF SUPERMAJORITY ENFORCE-
15 MENT.—Notwithstanding any provision of the Congres-
16 sional Budget Act of 1974, subsections (c)(2) and (d)(3)
17 of section 904 of the Congressional Budget Act of 1974
18 shall remain in effect for purposes of Senate enforcement
19 through October 1, 2007.

20 (b) PAY-AS-YOU-GO RULE IN THE SENATE.—

1 in net deficit reduction enacted pursuant to rec-
2 onciliation instructions since the beginning of
3 that same calendar year shall not be available”;

5 (B) in subsection (g), by striking “April
6 15, 2003” and inserting “October 1, 2007”.

3 **SEC. 3. SENSE OF THE SENATE ON EXTENSION OF STATU-**
4 **TORY DISCRETIONARY SPENDING CAPS.**

5 It is the sense of the Senate that Congress and the
6 President should negotiate and agree on the appropriate
7 discretionary spending levels and extend the statutory dis-
8 cretionary spending caps for 2003 and beyond as early
9 as possible during the 108th Congress in a manner con-
10 sistent with fiscal disciplines and accountability.
