A BILL

To amend title 23, United States Code, to require the use of a certain minimum amount of funds for winter motorized access trails.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. WINTER MOTORIZED ACCESS TRAILS.

- 4 Section 206 of title 23, United States Code, is
 5 amended—
- 6 (1) in subsection (a), by adding at the end the7 following:
- 8 "(3) SNOWMACHINE.—The term 'snowmachine'
 9 means a motorized off-road vehicle intended to oper-

1	ate on snow, and which is propelled by means of a
2	revolving track or tracks."; and
3	(2) in subsection (d), by adding at the end the
4	following:
5	"(5) WINTER MOTORIZED ACCESS TRAILS.—
6	"(A) USE OF FUNDS.—
7	"(i) Determination by the sec-
8	RETARY.—The Secretary shall annually es-
9	timate revenues to the Highway Trust
10	Fund derived from fuel purchased in each
11	State for use in snowmachines, using infor-
12	mation submitted by—
13	"(I) the Department of Com-
14	merce;
15	"(II) the Department of the
16	Treasury;
17	"(III) the International Snow-
18	mobile Manufacturers Association;
19	and
20	"(IV) any other appropriate
21	sources.
22	"(ii) Use of funds.—
23	"(I) IN GENERAL.—Of amounts
24	made available to a State for motor-
25	ized access under the recreational

1	trails program, not less than the
2	amount that is equal to the revenues
3	derived from fuel purchased for use in
4	the State by snowmachines, as esti-
5	mated by the Secretary under clause
6	(i), shall be used for activities that en-
7	hance winter motorized recreational
8	trails, including—
9	"(aa) trails on Bureau of
10	Land Management or National
11	Forest land where such uses are
12	not prohibited by law; and
13	"(bb) trails designed for di-
14	verse uses in other seasons.
15	"(II) ACTIVITIES.—A State may
16	use funds under subclause (I) to—
17	"(aa) locate, survey, and
18	map winter motorized-use or
19	multiple-use trails;
20	"(bb) document or secure
21	public rights-of-way for trails;
22	"(cc) reroute trails where
23	necessary;
24	"(dd) design and construct
25	new trail routes;

1	"(ee) link existing trail sys-

2	tems;
3	"(ff) build trailhead facili-
4	ties;
5	"(gg) improve trails for safe
6	travel and multiple uses;
7	"(hh) establish safety caches
8	of first aid and emergency gear;
9	"(ii) sign and mark trails;
10	"(jj) purchase trail building
11	and grooming equipment; and
12	"(kk) mobilize trail volun-
13	teers as maintenance crews, safe-
14	ty patrols, and trail ambassadors.
15	"(B) Public information campaigns.—
16	"(i) IN GENERAL.—Of the sums avail-
17	able to the Secretary for the administra-
18	tion of and research and technical assist-
19	ance under the recreational trails program
20	and for administration of the National
21	Recreational Trails Advisory Committee,
22	\$50,000 shall be used for each fiscal year
23	for public information campaigns edu-
24	cating the public about, and encouraging,
25	the safe use of snowmachines.

- "(ii) CONTENT.—In designing the 1 2 content of public information campaigns 3 under clause (i), the Secretary shall consult with— 4 "(I) representatives of 5 snowmachine manufacturers and 6 7 users; and
 - "(II) the Advertising Council.".
