## **CONCURRENT RESOLUTION**

Recognizing that prevention of suicide is a compelling national priority.

- 1 Whereas suicide is one of the most disruptive and tragic
- 2 events a family and a community can experience, and
- 3 it occurs at a national rate of 30,000 suicides annu-
- 4 ally;
- 5 Whereas suicide is the fastest growing cause of death
- among youths and the second leading cause of deathamong college students;
- 8 Whereas suicide kills youths 6 to 9 times more often than
- 9 homicide;
- 10 Whereas research shows that 95 percent of all suicides are
- 11 preventable;
- 12 Whereas research shows that the prevention of suicide
- 13 must be recognized as a national priority;

1 Whereas community awareness and education will encour-2 age the development of strategies to prevent suicide; 3 Whereas during the 105th Congress, both the Senate and 4 the House of Representatives unanimously agreed to 5 resolutions recognizing suicide as a national problem 6 and declaring suicide prevention programs to be a na-7 tional priority (Senate Resolution 84, 105th Congress, 8 agreed to May 6, 1997, and House of Representatives 9 Resolution 212, 105th Congress, agreed to October 9, 10 1998);

11 Whereas the yellow ribbon is rapidly becoming recognized
12 internationally as the symbol for the awareness and
13 prevention of suicide, and it is recognized and used
14 by suicide prevention groups, crisis centers, schools,
15 churches, youth centers, hospitals, counselors, teach16 ers, parents, and especially youth themselves; and
17 Whereas the week beginning September 19, 2004, should

18 be recognized as Yellow Ribbon Suicide Awareness19 and Prevention Week: Now, therefore, be it

20 Resolved by the Senate (the House of Representatives con21 curring), That Congress—

(1) recognizes that the need to increase awareness
about and prevent suicide is a compelling national
priority;

1 (2) reaffirms the commitment of Congress to the 2 priorities expressed by the 105th Congress, in Sen-3 ate Resolution 84 and House Resolution 212, to con-4 tinue to recognize suicide prevention as a national 5 priority; and

6 (3) encourages Americans, communities, and the
7 Nation to work to increase awareness about and pre8 vent suicide.
