CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Directing the Architect of the Capitol to establish a temporary exhibit in the rotunda of the Capitol to honor the memory of members of the United States Armed Forces who have lost their lives in Operation Iraqi Freedom and Operation Enduring Freedom.

3 **SECTION 1. EXHIBIT IN ROTUNDA OF THE CAPITOL IN**
4 **HONOR OF MEMBERS OF ARMED FORCES**
5 **KILLED IN IRAQ AND AFGHANISTAN.**

6 (a) ESTABLISHMENT OF TEMPORARY EXHIBIT.—

7 During the period beginning on October 1, 2004, and end-

1 ing on November 30, 2004, the Architect of the Capitol
2 shall display in the rotunda of the Capitol an exhibit to
3 honor the memory of members of the United States Armed
4 Forces who have lost their lives in Operation Iraqi Free-
5 dom and Operation Enduring Freedom.

6 (b) FORM OF EXHIBIT.—The exhibit displayed under
7 this section shall be in such form and contain such mate-
8 rial as the Architect may select, so long as—

9 (1) the exhibit displays the name, photograph,
10 and biographical information with respect to each in-
11 dividual member of the United States Armed Forces
12 who has lost his or her life in the Operations re-
13 ferred to in subsection (a); and

14 (2) the exhibit provides an opportunity for visi-
15 tors to write messages of support and sympathy to
16 the families of the individuals represented in the ex-
17 hibit and to have those messages transmitted to the
18 families.
