## RESOLUTION

To authorize representation by the Senate Legal Counsel  
in *Newdow v. Eagen, et al.*

Whereas S. Res. 343, 107th Congress, authorizes the Senate Legal Counsel to represent the Secretary of the Senate and the Senate Financial Clerk in the case of *Newdow v. Eagen, et al.*, Case No. 1:02CV01704, pending in the United States District Court for the District of Columbia;

Whereas additional defendants have been named in that case;

Whereas, pursuant to sections 703(a) and 704(a)(1) of the Ethics in Government Act of 1978, 2 U.S.C. §§ 288b(a) and 288c(a)(1), the Senate may direct its counsel to represent officers and employees of the Senate in civil ac-

tions with respect to their official responsibilities: Now, therefore, be it
