Authorizing expenditures by the Committee on Armed Services.

IN THE SENATE OF THE UNITED STATES

FEBRUARY 13, 2003

Mr. WARNER, from the Committee on Armed Services, reported the following original resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Rules and Administration

RESOLUTION

Authorizing expenditures by the Committee on Armed
Services.

1 *Resolved*, That, in carrying out its powers, duties, and
2 functions under the Standing Rules of the Senate, in ac-
3 cordance with its jurisdiction under rule XXV of such
4 rules, including holding hearings, reporting such hearings,
5 and making investigations as authorized by paragraphs 1
6 and 8 of rule XXVI of the Standing Rules of the Senate,
7 the Committee on Armed Services is authorized from
8 March 1, 2003, through September 30, 2003; October 1,
9 2003, through September 30, 2004; and October 1, 2004,
10 through February 28, 2005, in its discretion (1) to make

1 expenditures from the contingent fund of the Senate, (2)
2 to employ personnel, and (3) with the prior consent of the
3 Government department or agency concerned and the
4 Committee on Rules and Administration, to use on a reim-
5 bursable or nonreimbursable basis the services of per-
6 sonnel of any such department or agency.

7 SEC. 2. (a) The expenses of the committee for the
8 period March 1, 2003, through September 30, 2003,
9 under this resolution shall not exceed \$3,594,172.

10 (b) For the period October 1, 2003, through Sep-
11 tember 30, 2004, expenses of the committee under this
12 resolution shall not exceed \$6,328,829.

13 (c) For the period October 1, 2004, through Feb-
14 ruary 28, 2005, expenses of the committee under this res-
15 olution shall not exceed \$2,698,836.

16 SEC. 3. The committee shall report its findings, to-
17 gether with such recommendations for legislation as it
18 deems advisable, to the Senate at the earliest practicable
19 date, but not later than February 28, 2005.

20 SEC. 4. The Committee on Armed Services is author-
21 ized from March 1, 2003, until otherwise provided by law,
22 to expend not to exceed \$10,000 each fiscal year to assist
23 the Senate properly to discharge and coordinate its activi-
24 ties and responsibilities in connection with participation
25 in various interparliamentary institutions and to facilitate

1 the interchange and reception in the United States of
2 members of foreign legislative bodies and prominent offi-
3 cials of foreign governments, foreign armed forces, and
4 intergovernmental organizations.

5 SEC. 5. Expenses of the committee under this resolu-
6 tion shall be paid from the contingent fund of the Senate
7 upon vouchers approved by the chairman of the com-
8 mittee, except that vouchers shall not be required (1) for
9 the disbursement of salaries of employees paid at an an-
10 nual rate, or (2) for the payment of telecommunications
11 provided by the Office of the Sergeant at Arms and Door-
12 keeper, United States Senate, or (3) for the payment of
13 stationery supplies purchased through the Keeper of the
14 Stationery, United States Senate, or (4) for payments to
15 the Postmaster, United States Senate, or (5) for the pay-
16 ment of metered charges on copying equipment provided
17 by the Office of the Sergeant at Arms and Doorkeeper,
18 United States Senate, or (6) for the payment of Senate
19 Recording and Photographic Services, or (7) for payment
20 of franked and mass mail costs by the Sergeant at Arms
21 and Doorkeeper, United State Senate.

22 SEC. 6. There are authorized such sums as may be
23 necessary for agency contributions related to the com-
24 pensation of employees of the committee from March 1,
25 2003, through September 30, 2003; October 1, 2003,

1 through September 30, 2004; and October 1, 2004,
2 through February 28, 2005, to be paid from the Appro-
3 priations account for “Expenses of Inquiries and Inves-
4 tigations”.

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
