CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Expressing the condolences and deepest sympathies of the Congress in the aftermath of the recent school shooting at Red Lake High School in Red Lake, Minnesota.

Whereas, on March 21, 2005, a troubled teenager opened fire at the Red Lake High School in Red Lake, Minnesota, killing five students, one teacher, and one security guard, after previously killing his grandfather and his grandfather's companion in their own home, before killing himself: Now, therefore, be it

3	(1) condemns, in the strongest possible terms
4	the tragic violence which occurred at Red Lake High
5	School in Red Lake, Minnesota;
6	(2) honors the heroism and memory of Derrick
7	Brun, whose courageous actions and self-sacrifice no
8	doubt saved the lives of others;
9	(3) honors the heroism, courage, and memory
10	of Daryl Lussier, Michelle Sigana, Neva Rogers
11	Dewayne Lewis, Chase Lussier, Alicia Spike
12	Thurlene Stillday, and Chanelle Rosebear, who lost
13	their lives in this terrible tragedy;
14	(4) offers condolences to all of the families
15	friends, and loved ones of the victims;
16	(5) honors the heroism of Ryan Auginash, Ste-
17	ven Cobenais, Lance Crowe, Jeffrey May, and Cody
18	Thunder, all of whom were wounded, and expresses
19	hope for the rapid and complete recovery of these
20	victims as well as support for their families, friends
21	and loved ones;
22	(6) applauds the Red Lake Band of Chippewa
23	for their strength as a community in dealing with
24	this tracedy.

1	(7) applauds the hard work, dedication, and
2	professional conduct exhibited by local, State, and
3	Federal law enforcement officials and the other com-
4	munity leaders and private citizens who offered their
5	support and assistance; and
6	(8) applauds the hard work and dedication of
7	the health care personnel and commends them for
8	providing tireless and sensitive care to the victims,
9	the families, and the entire community;
10	(9) encourages the American people to renew
11	their commitment to and support for efforts to pre-
12	vent school violence.
