## **CONCURRENT RESOLUTION**

Providing for acceptance of a statue of Po'Pay, presented by the State of New Mexico, for placement in National Statuary Hall, and for other purposes.

- Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate concurring),

  SECTION 1. ACCEPTANCE OF STATUE OF PO'PAY FROM THE
- 4 PEOPLE OF NEW MEXICO FOR PLACEMENT IN
- 5 NATIONAL STATUARY HALL.
- 6 (a) In General.—The statue of Po'Pay, furnished
- 7 by the people of New Mexico for placement in National
- 8 Statuary Hall in accordance with section 1814 of the Re-
- 9 vised Statutes of the United States (2 U.S.C. 2131), is

- 1 accepted in the name of the United States, and the thanks
- 2 of the Congress are tendered to the people of New Mexico
- 3 for providing this commemoration of one of New Mexico's
- 4 most eminent personages.
- 5 (b) Presentation Ceremony.—The State of New
- 6 Mexico is authorized to use the Rotunda of the Capitol
- 7 on September 22, 2005, for a presentation ceremony for
- 8 the statue. The Architect of the Capitol and the Capitol
- 9 Police Board shall take such action as may be necessary
- 10 with respect to physical preparations and security for the
- 11 ceremony.
- 12 (c) DISPLAY IN ROTUNDA.—The statue shall be dis-
- 13 played in the Rotunda of the Capitol for a period of not
- 14 more than 6 months, after which period the statue shall
- 15 be moved to its permanent location in the National Stat-
- 16 uary Hall.
- 17 SEC. 2. TRANSMITTAL TO GOVERNOR OF NEW MEXICO.
- 18 The Clerk of the House of Representatives shall
- 19 transmit an enrolled copy of this concurrent resolution to
- 20 the Governor of New Mexico.
