1SECTION 1. EXHIBIT IN ROTUNDA OF THE CAPITOL IN2HONOR OF MEMBERS OF ARMED FORCES3KILLED IN IRAQ AND AFGHANISTAN.

4 (a) ESTABLISHMENT OF TEMPORARY EXHIBIT.—
5 During the period beginning on May 29, 2006, and ending
6 on July 4, 2006, the Architect of the Capitol shall display
7 in the rotunda of the Capitol an exhibit to honor the mem8 ory of the members of the United States Armed Forces
9 who have lost their lives in Operation Iraqi Freedom and
10 Operation Enduring Freedom.

(b) FORM OF EXHIBIT.—The exhibit displayed under
this section shall be in such form and contain such material as the Architect may select, so long as—

(1) the exhibit displays the name, photograph,
and biographical information with respect to each individual member of the United States Armed Forces
who has lost his or her life in the Operations referred to in subsection (a); and

(2) the exhibit provides an opportunity for visitors to write messages of support and sympathy to
the families of the individuals represented in the exhibit and provides a means to ensure that those messages are transmitted to the families.
