2	"Section 1. Every person has the right to work, to
3	free choice of employment, to just and favorable conditions
4	of work, and to protection against unemployment.
5	"Section 2. Every person, without any discrimina
6	tion, has the right to equal pay for equal work.
7	"Section 3. Every person who works has the right
8	to just and favorable remuneration ensuring for them-
9	selves and their family an existence worthy of human dig
10	nity, and supplemented, if necessary, by other means of
11	social protection.
12	"Section 4. Every person who works has the right
13	to form and join trade unions for the protection of their
14	interests.
15	"Section 5. The Congress shall have power to en-
16	force and implement this article by appropriate legisla-
