# **JOINT RESOLUTION**

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States to limit the power of Federal courts to force a State or local government to levy or increase taxes.

- 1 Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives
- 2 of the United States of America in Congress assembled
- 3 (two-thirds of each House concurring therein),
- 4 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 5 This Joint Resolution may be cited as the "No Tax-
- 6 ation Without Representation Amendment".

#### 1 SEC. 2. PROPOSAL OF AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION

- 2 OF THE UNITED STATES.
- 3 That the following article is proposed as an amend-
- 4 ment to the Constitution of the United States, which shall
- 5 be valid to all intents and purposes as part of the Con-
- 6 stitution when ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths
- 7 of the several States within seven years after the date of
- 8 its submission for ratification:
- 9 "ARTICLE —
- "Section 1. Neither the Supreme Court nor any in-
- 11 ferior court of the United States shall have the power to
- 12 instruct or order a State or political subdivision thereof,
- 13 or an official of such State or political subdivision, to levy
- 14 or increase taxes.
- 15 "Section 2. Neither the Supreme Court nor any in-
- 16 ferior court of the United States shall have the power to
- 17 instruct or order a state or political subdivision thereof,
- 18 or an official of such State or political subdivision, on how
- 19 to spend, allocate, or budget fiscal resources.".
