## A BILL

For the relief of Jose Manuel Guzman-Morales.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, 2 3 SECTION 1. PERMANENT RESIDENT STATUS FOR JOSE 4 MANUEL GUZMAN-MORALES. 5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding subsections (a) 6 and (b) of section 201 of the Immigration and Nationality 7 Act, Jose Manuel Guzman-Morales shall be eligible for issuance of an immigrant visa or for adjustment of status 8 9 to that of an alien lawfully admitted for permanent residence upon filing an application for issuance of an immi-10 grant visa under section 204 of such Act or for adjustment 11 12 of status to lawful permanent resident.

1 (b) ADJUSTMENT OF STATUS.—If Jose Manuel 2 Guzman-Morales enters the United States before the filing 3 deadline specified in subsection (c), he shall be considered 4 to have entered and remained lawfully and shall, if other-5 wise eligible, be eligible for adjustment of status under 6 section 245 of the Immigration and Nationality Act as of 7 the date of the enactment of this Act.

(c) DEADLINE FOR APPLICATION AND PAYMENT OF 8 9 FEES.—Subsections (a) and (b) shall apply only if the ap-10 plication for issuance of an immigrant visa or the application for adjustment of status is filed with appropriate fees 11 within 2 years after the date of the enactment of this Act. 12 13 (d) REDUCTION OF IMMIGRANT VISA NUMBER.— Upon the granting of an immigrant visa or permanent res-14 15 idence to Jose Manuel Guzman-Morales, the Secretary of State shall instruct the proper officer to reduce by 1, dur-16 17 ing the current or next following fiscal year, the total number of immigrant visas that are made available to natives 18 of the country of the alien's birth under section 203(a)19 20 of the Immigration and Nationality Act or, if applicable, 21 the total number of immigrant visas that are made avail-22 able to natives of the country of the alien's birth under 23 section 202(e) of such Act.

24 (e) Denial of Preferential Immigration25 Treatment for Certain Relatives.—The natural

parents, brothers, and sisters of Jose Manuel Guzman-Mo rales shall not, by virtue of such relationship, be accorded
any right, privilege, or status under the Immigration and
Nationality Act.
