AN ACT

To authorize the establishment at Antietam National Battlefield of a memorial to the officers and enlisted men of the Fifth, Sixth, and Ninth New Hampshire Volunteer Infantry Regiments and the First New Hampshire Light Artillery Battery who fought in the Battle of Antietam on September 17, 1862, and for other purposes. 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, 3 SECTION 1. ESTABLISHMENT OF NEW HAMPSHIRE MEMO-4 RIAL, ANTIETAM NATIONAL BATTLEFIELD, 5 MARYLAND. 6 (a) MEMORIAL AUTHORIZED.—The Secretary of the 7 Interior shall authorize the establishment, at a suitable lo-8 cation approved by the Secretary within the boundaries 9 of Antietam National Battlefield, of a memorial to the offi-

10 cers and enlisted men of the Fifth, Sixth, and Ninth New
11 Hampshire Volunteer Infantry Regiments and the First
12 New Hampshire Light Artillery Battery who fought in the
13 Battle of Antietam on September 17, 1862.

(b) AUTHORIZED ENTITY.—The Secretary shall se15 lect the persons who will be permitted to establish the me16 morial authorized by subsection (a).

17 (c) DESIGN APPROVALS.—The size, design, and in18 scriptions of the memorial authorized by subsection (a)
19 shall be subject to the approval of the Secretary.

(d) PROHIBITION ON USE OF FEDERAL FUNDS FOR
21 ESTABLISHMENT.—No Federal funds may be expended to
22 design the memorial authorized by subsection (a), to ac23 quire the memorial, to prepare the site selected for the
24 memorial, or to install the memorial.

1 (e) SUSPENSION FOR MISREPRESENTATION IN FUNDRAISING.—The Secretary may suspend the authority 2 3 of the persons selected under subsection (b) to establish 4 the memorial authorized by subsection (a) if the Secretary 5 determines that fundraising efforts relating to the memorial have misrepresented an affiliation with the memorial 6 7 or the Federal Government.

8 (f) ANNUAL REPORT.—Until the memorial author-9 ized by subsection (a) is installed, the persons selected 10 under subsection (b) to establish the memorial shall sub-11 mit to the Secretary an annual report of operations related 12 to fundraising efforts for the memorial and progress on 13 the establishment of the memorial.

14 (g) MAINTENANCE.—Upon installation of the memo-15 rial authorized by subsection (a), the Secretary shall assume responsibility for the maintenance of the memorial. 16 The Secretary may accept contributions for the mainte-17 nance of the memorial from the persons selected under 18 19 subsection (b) to establish the memorial and from other 20 persons. Amounts accepted under this subsection shall be merged with other funds available to the Secretary for the 21

1 maintenance of the memorial and credited to a separate

2 account with the National Park Service.
