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## A BILL

To amend the National Trails System Act to direct the Secretary of the Interior and the Secretary of Agriculture to jointly conduct a study on the feasibility of designating the Arizona Trail as a national scenic trail or a national historic trail.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Arizona Trail Feasi-  
5 bility Study Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. ARIZONA TRAIL FEASIBILITY STUDY.**

2 Section 5(c) of the National Trails System Act (16  
3 U.S.C. 1244(c)) is amended—

4 (1) by redesignating paragraph (42), relating to  
5 the Long Walk Trail, as paragraph (41);

6 (2) by redesignating paragraph (41), relating to  
7 the Metacomet-Monadnock-Mattabesett Trail, as  
8 paragraph (42); and

9 (3) by adding at the end the following new  
10 paragraph:

11 “(43) ARIZONA TRAIL.—

12 “(A) IN GENERAL.—The Arizona Trail, extend-  
13 ing approximately 790 miles through Arizona from  
14 the border between Arizona and Utah to the inter-  
15 national border with Mexico, as generally depicted  
16 on the map entitled ‘Arizona Trail-DRAFT’ and  
17 dated March, 22, 2004, and that consists of a cor-  
18 ridor of open space that—

19 “(i) includes 7 ecological zones;

20 “(ii) features deserts, canyons, mountains,  
21 lakes, and rivers; and

22 “(iii) connects 6 wilderness areas, 4 na-  
23 tional forests, 2 national parks, and 30 outdoor  
24 recreational areas.

1           “(B) REQUIREMENT.—The Secretary of the In-  
2           terior and the Secretary of Agriculture shall jointly  
3           conduct the study under subparagraph (A).

4           “(C) AVAILABILITY OF MAP.—The map de-  
5           scribed in subparagraph (A) shall be on file and  
6           available for public inspection in the appropriate of-  
7           fices of the Bureau of Land Management.

8           “(D) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—  
9           There is authorized to be appropriated to carry out  
10          the study under subparagraph (A) \$200,000 for the  
11          period of fiscal years 2006 through 2008, of  
12          which—

13                 “(i) \$100,000 shall be made available to  
14                 the Secretary of Agriculture; and

15                 “(ii) \$100,000 shall be made available to  
16                 the Secretary of the Interior.”.

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
