3 SECTION 1. ACRYLIC OR MODACRYLIC SYNTHETIC STAPLE 4 FIBERS, NOT CARDED, COMBED, OR OTHER-

WISE PROCESSED FOR SPINNING.

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6 (a) IN GENERAL.—Subchapter II of chapter 99 of
