Mr. BRADLEY of New Hampshire (for himself and Mr. MEEHAN) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Armed Services

A BILL

To require the Secretary of Defense to develop and implement a plan to provide chiropractic health care services and benefits as part of the TRICARE program.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Chiropractic Health
5 Parity for Military Retirees and Dependents Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. CHIROPRACTIC HEALTH CARE FOR RETIREES, DE-**
7 **PENDENTS, AND SURVIVORS.**

8 (a) PLAN REQUIRED.—Not later than July 31, 2005,
9 the Secretary of Defense shall complete development of a

1 plan to provide chiropractic health care services and bene-
2 fits, as a permanent part of the TRICARE program, for
3 covered beneficiaries.

4 (b) CONTENTS OF PLAN.—The plan shall require
5 that a contract entered into under section 1097 of title
6 10, United States Code, for the delivery of health care
7 services shall—

8 (1) include the delivery of chiropractic services;

9 (2) require that chiropractic services may be
10 provided only by a doctor of chiropractic; and

11 (3) provide that a covered beneficiary may se-
12 lect and have direct access to a doctor of chiro-
13 practic without referral by another health practi-
14 tioner.

15 (c) IMPLEMENTATION OF PLAN.—The plan developed
16 under subsection (a) shall provide for implementation of
17 the plan to begin no later than December 31, 2005.

18 (d) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

19 (1) The term “chiropractic services”—

20 (A) includes the diagnosis (including by di-
21 agnostic X-ray tests), correction, and manage-
22 ment of vertebral subluxations or neuro-
23 musculoskeletal conditions, and such other
24 chiropractic services determined appropriate by
25 the Secretary; and

1 (B) does not include the use of drugs or
2 surgery.

3 (2) The term “covered beneficiary” has the
4 meaning provided by section 1072(5) of title 10,
5 United States Code.

6 (3) The term “doctor of chiropractic” includes
7 only a doctor of chiropractic who is licensed as such
8 by the State in which chiropractic services are fur-
9 nished.

10 (4) The term “TRICARE program” has the
11 meaning provided by section 1072(7) of title 10,
12 United States Code.

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
