A BILL

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “Internet Tax Non-
3 discrimination Act of 2005”.

4 **SEC. 2. AMENDMENT TO THE INTERNET TAX FREEDOM**
5 **ACT.**

6 The Internet Tax Freedom Act (47 U.S.C. 151 note)
7 is amended in section 1101(a) by striking “during the pe-
8 riod beginning November 1, 2003, and ending November
9 1, 2007”.
