A BILL

To amend title 10, United States Code, to provide that an officer of the Army or Air Force on the active-duty list may not be promoted to brigadier general unless the officer has had a duty assignment of at least one year involving the administration of the National Guard or Reserves.

1	SECTION 1. GUARD OR RESERVE DUTY ASSIGNMENT RE-
2	QUIRED AS CONDITION OF PROMOTION OF
3	ARMY AND AIR FORCE OFFICERS TO BRIGA-
4	DIER GENERAL.
5	(a) In General.—Chapter 36 of title 10, is amended
6	by inserting after section 619a the following new section:
7	"§ 619b. Eligibility for consideration for promotion:
8	Army and Air Force officers; Guard or
9	Reserve duty required before promotion
10	to brigadier general; exceptions
11	"(a) GENERAL RULE.—After the end of the one-year
12	period beginning on the date of the enactment of this sec-
13	tion, an officer on the active-duty list of the Army or Air
14	Force may not be appointed to the grade of brigadier gen-
15	eral unless the officer has completed a tour of duty of at
16	least one year in a Guard or Reserve duty assignment.
17	"(b) Exceptions.—Subject to subsection (c), the
18	Secretary of Defense may waive subsection (a) in the fol-
19	lowing circumstances:
20	"(1) When necessary for the good of the serv-
21	ice.
22	"(2) In the case of an officer whose proposed
23	selection for promotion is based primarily upon sci-
24	entific and technical qualifications for which Guard
25	or Reserve requirements do not exist.
26	"(3) In the case of—

1	"(A) a medical officer, dental officer, vet-
2	erinary officer, medical service officer, nurse, or
3	biomedical science officer;
4	"(B) a chaplain; or
5	"(C) a judge advocate.
6	"(4) In the case of an officer selected by a pro-
7	motion board for appointment to the grade of briga-
8	dier general while serving in a Guard or Reserve
9	duty assignment if at least 180 days of that assign-
10	ment have been completed on the date of the con-
11	vening of that selection board.
12	"(c) Regulations.—The Secretary of Defense shall
13	prescribe regulations to carry out this section. The regula-
14	tions shall specifically identify for purposes of subsection
15	(b)(2) those categories of officers for which selection for
16	promotion to brigadier general is based primarily upon sci-
17	entific and technical qualifications for which Guard or Re-
18	serve requirements do not exist.
19	"(d) Guard or Reserve Duty Assignment De-
20	FINED.—In this section, the term 'Guard or Reserve duty
21	assignment' means an assignment involving the orga-
22	nizing, administering, recruiting, instructing, or training
23	the reserve components, other than an assignment to a
24	Reserve Officers Training Corps unit.".

- 1 (b) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sections
- 2 at the beginning of subchapter II of such chapter is
- 3 amended by inserting after the item relating to section
- 4 619a the following new item:

"619b. Eligibility for consideration for promotion: Army and Air Force officers; Guard or Reserve duty required before promotion to brigadier general; exceptions.".
