A BILL

To authorize the Secretary of Education to make grants to States to establish statewide screening programs for children who are 5 to 7 years of age to prevent reading failure.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Reading Failure Pre-
5 vention Act of 2005”.

1 **SEC. 2. GRANTS FOR SCREENING TO PREVENT READING**
2 **FAILURE.**

3 (a) GRANTS.—The Secretary of Education may make
4 grants to States to establish statewide screening programs
5 for children who are 5 to 7 years of age for the prevention
6 of reading failure.

7 (b) USE OF FUNDS.—The Secretary may not make
8 a grant to a State under this section unless the State
9 agrees to use the grant for the following:

10 (1) Development and implementation of a state-
11 wide screening program for children who are 5 to 7
12 years of age to prevent reading failure by screening
13 such children for traits that indicate the children
14 have dyslexia or are otherwise at risk of reading fail-
15 ure.

16 (2) Providing adequate professional develop-
17 ment for personnel who administer screening pro-
18 grams under this section.

19 (c) DETERMINATION OF TRAITS.—The Secretary,
20 using reliable, replicated, and scientifically-based research,
21 shall enumerate specific traits that may be screened under
22 this section to determine whether a child has dyslexia or
23 is otherwise at risk of reading failure.

24 (d) APPLICATION.—To seek a grant under this sec-
25 tion, a State shall submit an application to the Secretary

1 at such time, in such manner, and containing such infor-
2 mation as the Secretary may reasonably require.

3 (e) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

4 (1) The term “Secretary” means the Secretary
5 of Education.

6 (2) The term “State” includes the several
7 States, the District of Columbia, the Commonwealth
8 of Puerto Rico, the Commonwealth of the Northern
9 Mariana Islands, American Samoa, Guam, the Vir-
10 gin Islands, and any other territory or possession of
11 the United States.

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
