Mr. GARY G. MILLER of California introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means

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## A BILL

To suspend temporarily the duty on Dichloroethyl Ether.

1        *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4        This Act may be cited as the “DCEE Tariff Suspen-  
5 sion Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. DICHLOROETHYL ETHER.**

7        (a) IN GENERAL.—Subchapter II of chapter 99 of  
8 the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States is  
9 amended by inserting in numerical sequence the following  
10 new heading:

“	9902.05.38	Dichloroethyl Ether (1,1'-oxybis [2-chloroethane] CL-CH <sub>2</sub> -CH <sub>2</sub> -O-CH <sub>2</sub> -CH <sub>2</sub> -CL) (provided for in subheading 2909.19.18) .....	Free	No change	No change	On or before 12/31/2014	”.
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1           (b) **EFFECTIVE DATE.**—The amendment made by  
2 subsection (a) applies with respect to goods entered, or  
3 withdrawn from warehouse for consumption, on or after  
4 the 15th day after the date of the enactment of this Act.

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
