## A BILL

To amend the Congressional Budget Act of 1974 to protect Social Security beneficiaries against any reduction in benefits.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4       This Act may be cited as the “Social Security Protec-  
5       tion Act of 2005”.

1 **SEC. 2. PROTECTION OF SOCIAL SECURITY BENEFICIARI.**

2 Section 312 of the Congressional Budget Act of 1974  
3 is amended by adding at the end the following new sub-  
4 section:

5 “(g) POINT OF ORDER TO PROTECT SOCIAL SECU-  
6 RITY BENEFITS.—(1) It shall not be in order in the House  
7 of Representatives or the Senate to consider any bill or  
8 joint resolution, or amendment thereto or conference re-  
9 port thereon, that—

10 “(A) reduces or has the effect of reducing any  
11 current benefits under the old-age, survivors, and  
12 disability insurance programs under title II of the  
13 Social Security Act; or

14 “(B) provides for or has the effect of providing  
15 for cost-of-living increases of benefits under the old-  
16 age, survivors, and disability insurance programs  
17 under title II of the Social Security Act that are less  
18 than what would be provided under title II of the  
19 Social Security Act as of the day of consideration of  
20 the applicable measure.

21 “(2) As used in paragraph (1), the term ‘current’,  
22 when referring to benefits, means benefits payable as of  
23 the day of consideration of the applicable measure.”.

24 **SEC. 3. SUPER-MAJORITY REQUIREMENT IN THE SENATE.**

25 Section 904 of the Congressional Budget Act of 1974  
26 is amended—

- 1           (1) in subsection (c)(2), by striking “and
- 2       312(c)” and inserting “312(c), and 312(g)”; and
- 3           (2) in subsection (d)(3), by striking “and
- 4       312(c)” and by inserting “312(c), and 312(g)”.
