A BILL

To amend title 5, United States Code, to require executive agencies to pay the premiums for health care coverage provided under the Federal Employees Health Benefits program for reservists in the Armed Forces called or ordered to active duty for more than 30 days.

2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Health Care Relief
5 for Military Families Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. PAYMENT OF FEHBP PREMIUMS FOR CERTAIN RE-**
2 **SERVISTS CALLED OR ORDERED TO ACTIVE**
3 **DUTY.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—(1) Chapter 89 of title 5, United
5 States Code, is amended by inserting after section 8905a
6 the following new section:

7 **“§ 8905b. Payment of premiums for certain reservists**
8 **called or ordered to active duty**

9 “An employing agency shall be responsible for pay-
10 ing, for any employee who is a member of a reserve compo-
11 nent of the armed forces who is called or ordered to active
12 duty for a period of more than 30 days, the employee’s
13 share of the premium for health care coverage provided
14 to such member under this chapter during such period.”.

15 (2) The table of sections at the beginning of such
16 chapter is amended by inserting after the item relating
17 to section 8905a the following new item:

“8905b. Payment of premiums for certain reservists called or ordered to active
duty.”.

18 (b) APPLICABILITY.—Section 8905b of title 5, United
19 States Code (as added by subsection (a)), shall apply with
20 respect to health care coverage provided to a member of
21 a reserve component of the Armed Forces on or after the
22 date of the enactment of this Act.

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
