A BILL

To authorize the grant program for elimination of the nationwide backlog in analyses of DNA samples at the level necessary to completely eliminate the backlog and obtain a DNA sample from every person convicted of a qualifying offense.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “DNA Database Com-
5 pletion Act of 2005”.

1 **SEC. 2. AUTHORIZATION OF DNA BACKLOG GRANTS AT**
2 **LEVEL NECESSARY TO COMPLETELY ELIMI-**
3 **NATE BACKLOG AND OBTAIN DNA SAMPLES**
4 **FROM ALL PERSONS CONVICTED OF QUALI-**
5 **FYING OFFENSES.**

6 Subsection (j) of section 2 of the DNA Analysis
7 Backlog Elimination Act of 2000 (42 U.S.C. 14135) is
8 amended to read as follows:

9 “(j) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There
10 are authorized to be appropriated to the Attorney General
11 for grants under subsection (a)—

12 “(1) for grants under paragraph (1) of such
13 subsection, \$100,000,000 for each of fiscal years
14 2005 through 2009; and

15 “(2) for grants under other paragraphs of such
16 subsection, \$151,000,000 for each of fiscal years
17 2005 through 2009.”.
