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## A BILL

To amend the Clean Air Act to prohibit stationary sources located in ozone nonattainment areas from purchasing nitrogen oxide emission credits under the Environmental Protection Agency's nitrogen oxide trading program without the consent of the State in which such source is located, and for other purposes.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. NO<sub>x</sub> EMISSION TRADING BY SOURCES IN**  
2 **OZONE NONATTAINMENT AREAS.**

3 Section 126 of the Clean Air Act (42 U.S.C. 7426)  
4 is amended by adding the following new subsection at the  
5 end thereof:

6 “(d) NO<sub>x</sub> Trading.—No stationary source of oxides  
7 of nitrogen that is located in an ozone nonattainment area  
8 may purchase nitrogen oxide emission credits under any  
9 emissions trading program established by the Environ-  
10 mental Protection Agency or use any other authority pro-  
11 vided by rules promulgated by the Administrator that  
12 would permit emissions of oxides of nitrogen from such  
13 source in excess of emission limits for that air pollutant  
14 otherwise applicable to that source under the State imple-  
15 mentation plan and section 407 of this Act.”.

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
