- 3 SECTION 1. REQUEST FOR POSTHUMOUS APPOINTMENT OF
- 4 MILTON HOLLAND AS A COMMISSIONED OF-
- 5 FICER IN THE ARMY.
- 6 (a) Request.—The President is authorized and re-
- 7 quested to issue, or have issued, a posthumous commission

- 1 in the grade of captain in the regular Army in the name
- 2 of Milton Holland, who, while sergeant major of the 5th
- 3 Regiment, United States Colored Infantry, was awarded
- 4 the Medal of Honor in recognition of his action on Sep-
- 5 tember 29, 1864, during the Battle of Chapin's Farm,
- 6 Virginia, when, as the citation for the medal states, Ser-
- 7 geant Major Holland "took command of Company C, after
- 8 all the officers had been killed or wounded, and gallantly
- 9 led it".
- 10 (b) Treatment of Benefits.—The provisions of
- 11 section 1523 of title 10, United States Code, apply in the
- 12 case of a commission issued as requested in subsection (a).
