ELIMINATION OF MEDICARE AND MEDICAID 4 COVERAGE FOR DRUGS WHEN USED FOR 5 TREATMENT OF ERECTILE DYSFUNCTION. 6 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 1927(d)(2) of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. 1396r–8(d)(2)) is amended by 7 8 adding at the end the following new subparagraph: "(K) Agents when used for the treatment 9

of erectile dysfunction.".

2	MEDICAID PROGRAM.—Section 1903(i) of such Act (42
3	U.S.C. 1396b(i)) is amended—
4	(1) by striking "or" at the end of paragraph
5	(19);
6	(2) by striking the period at the end of para-
7	graph (20) and inserting "; or"; and
8	(3) by inserting after paragraph (20) the fol-
9	lowing new paragraph:
10	"(21) with respect to amounts expended for
11	covered outpatient drugs described in section
12	1927(d)(2)(K) (relating to drugs when used for
13	treatment of erectile dysfunction).".
14	(c) Effective Date.—The amendments made by
15	this section shall apply to drugs dispensed on or after the
16	date of the enactment of this Act
