## A BILL

To provide an enhanced penalty for threatening to kill, injure, or intimidate an individual, or to cause property damage, by means of fire or an explosive on school property.

- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Zero Tolerance School
- 5 Terror Act".

1	SEC. 2. ENHANCED PENALTY FOR THREATENING TO KILL,
2	INJURE, OR INTIMIDATE AN INDIVIDUAL, OR
3	TO CAUSE PROPERTY DAMAGE, BY MEANS OF
4	FIRE OR AN EXPLOSIVE ON SCHOOL PROP-
5	ERTY.
6	Section 844(e) of title 18, United States Code, is
7	amended by adding at the end the following: "If the threat
8	or conveying of false information referred to in the pre-
9	ceding sentence concerns conduct on the grounds of a
10	school which provides elementary or secondary education
11	(as determined under State law), the maximum term of
12	imprisonment under this subsection shall be 20 years.".
