- 4 SEC. 2. DESIGNATION OF 1855 TREATY TRAIL FOR NA-
- 5 TIONAL TRAILS SYSTEM ACT STUDY.
- 6 Section 5(c) of the National Trails System Act (16
- 7 U.S.C. 1244(c)) is amended by adding at the end the fol-
- 8 lowing new paragraph:
- 9 "(43) 1855 Treaty Trail, which traces the route fol-
- 10 lowed by Governor Isaac Stevens of the Washington Terri-
- 11 tory and Joel Palmer, Superintendent of Indian Affairs
- 12 for the Oregon Territory, in 1855 when they negotiated
- 13 treaties with the Indian tribes of northeastern Oregon,
- 14 Washington, northern Idaho and western Montana.".
