A BILL

To require the Secretary of Homeland Security to prevent all unlawful entries into the United States by January 1, 2007, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Secure the Outside
5 Perimeter (STOP) Act of 2005”.

1 **SEC. 2. ELIMINATION OF ALL UNLAWFUL ENTRIES INTO**
2 **THE UNITED STATES.**

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than January 1, 2007,
4 the Secretary of Homeland Security, using such means as
5 the Secretary deems necessary, shall prevent all illegal
6 border crossings into the United States.

7 (b) WAIVER.—The provisions of all laws of the
8 United States, including the Endangered Species Act of
9 1973 and the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969,
10 are waived to the extent that the Secretary of Homeland
11 Security determines necessary to carry out subsection (a).

12 (c) REPORT.—Not later than 180 days after the date
13 of the enactment of this Act, and every 180 days there-
14 after, the Secretary of Homeland Security shall submit a
15 report to the Congress on the steps the Secretary is taking
16 to carry out subsection (a), and the progress being made
17 towards full implementation of such subsection.
