## A BILL

To require the Secretary of Homeland Security to prevent all unlawful entries into the United States by January 1, 2007, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Secure the Outside
- 5 Perimeter (STOP) Act of 2005".

## 1 SEC. 2. ELIMINATION OF ALL UNLAWFUL ENTRIES INTO

- 2 THE UNITED STATES.
- 3 (a) In General.—Not later than January 1, 2007,
- 4 the Secretary of Homeland Security, using such means as
- 5 the Secretary deems necessary, shall prevent all illegal
- 6 border crossings into the United States.
- 7 (b) Waiver.—The provisions of all laws of the
- 8 United States, including the Endangered Species Act of
- 9 1973 and the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969,
- 10 are waived to the extent that the Secretary of Homeland
- 11 Security determines necessary to carry out subsection (a).
- 12 (c) Report.—Not later than 180 days after the date
- 13 of the enactment of this Act, and every 180 days there-
- 14 after, the Secretary of Homeland Security shall submit a
- 15 report to the Congress on the steps the Secretary is taking
- 16 to carry out subsection (a), and the progress being made
- 17 towards full implementation of such subsection.
