## AN ACT

To protect volunteers assisting the victims of Hurricane Katrina.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

### 1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 2 This Act may be cited as the "Katrina Volunteer Pro-
- 3 tection Act of 2005".

### 4 SEC. 2. PROTECTION OF VOLUNTEERS.

- 5 (a) QUALIFIED IMMUNITY FROM SUIT.—Any person
- 6 or entity (including any Indian Tribe) that, in response
- 7 to harm caused by Hurricane Katrina of 2005, voluntarily,
- 8 in good faith, and without a preexisting duty or expecta-
- 9 tion of compensation, renders aid (including medical treat-
- 10 ment and rescue assistance) to any individual, shall not
- 11 be liable for any injury (including personal injury, prop-
- 12 erty damage or loss, and death) arising out of or resulting
- 13 from that aid that was not caused by—
- 14 (1) willful, wanton, reckless or criminal conduct
- of that person or entity; or
- 16 (2) conduct of that person or entity that con-
- stitutes a violation of a Federal or State civil rights
- 18 law.
- 19 (b) Preemption.—This Act preempts the laws of a
- 20 State to the extent such laws are inconsistent with this
- 21 Act, except that this Act shall not preempt any State law

- 1 that provides additional protection from liability relating
- 2 to volunteers.
