A BILL

To provide additional funds to local educational agencies for elementary and secondary education and pupil services for students displaced by Hurricane Katrina, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Displaced Student Re-
- 5 lief Act".

1	SEC. 2. EDUCATION AND PUPIL SERVICES FOR ELEMEN
2	TARY AND SECONDARY STUDENTS DIS-
3	PLACED BY HURRICANE KATRINA.
4	(a) In General.—From funds appropriated under
5	this section, the Secretary of Education shall make grants
6	to local educational agencies in fiscal years 2005 and 2006
7	for the purpose of facilitating the enrollment, attendance
8	and success in public elementary and secondary schools
9	of displaced students.
10	(b) MAXIMUM GRANT AMOUNT.—The maximum
11	amount of the grant a local educational agency may re-
12	ceive under this section for any fiscal year is—
13	(1) the number of displaced students in the ge-
14	ographic area served by the local educational agency,
15	as determined by the Secretary; multiplied by
16	(2) \$8,305.
17	(c) USE OF FUNDS.—Local educational agencies
18	shall use funds received under this section for education
19	and pupil services for displaced students who are enrolled
20	in public schools served by the agency. Such services may
21	include the following:
22	(1) Outreach to families affected by a specified
23	hurricane disaster in order to facilitate such families
24	in enrolling displaced students in school.

- 1 (2) Hiring additional teachers, paraprofes-2 sionals, and pupil services personnel required due to 3 the enrollment of such students.
- 4 (3) Procurement of additional equipment and classroom supplies required due to the enrollment of such students.
 - (4) Procurement of additional classroom space required due to the enrollment of such students.
- 9 (5) Transportation services provided to such students.
- 11 (6) Counseling and other mental health services 12 for such students.
- 13 (d) APPLICATION.—No local educational agency may 14 receive a grant under this section unless the local edu-
- 15 cational agency submits an application to the Secretary
- 16 at such time, in such manner, and containing or accom-
- 17 panied by such information as the Secretary may reason-
- 18 ably require.

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- 19 (e) SCHOOL LUNCHES.—Notwithstanding any other
- 20 provision of law, a displaced student is deemed eligible for
- 21 free lunches under section 9 of the Richard B. Russell Na-
- 22 tional School Lunch Act (42 U.S.C. 1758).
- 23 (f) Reports.—6 months after the date of the enact-
- 24 ment of this Act, and every 6 months thereafter, the Sec-
- 25 retary of Education shall submit reports to the appro-

1	priate committees of the Congress concerning the imple-
2	mentation of this section.
3	(g) Definitions.—For purposes of this section:
4	(1) The term "child" means any person within
5	the age limits for which the State in which the per-
6	son is located provides free public education.
7	(2) The term "displaced student" means a child
8	who—
9	(A) is a homeless child or youth (as de-
10	fined in section 725 of the McKinney-Vento
11	Homeless Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 11434a));
12	(B) but for a specified hurricane disaster,
13	would be enrolled during a school year in an el-
14	ementary or secondary school in a State;
15	(C) is unable, due to such disaster, to ac-
16	cess the education and pupil services that the
17	child otherwise would be receiving at such
18	school; and
19	(D) due to such disaster, is enrolled at a
20	public elementary or secondary school in a dif-
21	ferent geographic location in a State.
22	(3) The term "local educational agency" has
23	the meaning given such term in section 9101 of the
24	Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965
25	(8 U.S.C. 7801).

- 1 (4) The terms "pupil services" and "pupil services personnel" have the meanings given such terms in section 9101 of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (8 U.S.C. 7801).
 - (5) The term "specified hurricane disaster" means any major disaster resulting from Hurricane Katrina declared by the President under the Robert T. Stafford Disaster and Emergency Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 5121 et seq.).
- 10 (6) The term "State" has the meaning given 11 such term in section 9101 of the Elementary and 12 Secondary Education Act of 1965 (8 U.S.C. 7801).
- 13 (h) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—To carry
 14 out this section, there are authorized to be appropriated
 15 such sums as may be necessary for fiscal years 2005 and
 16 2006. Amounts made available under the preceding sen17 tence for fiscal year 2005 shall remain available for ex18 penditure during fiscal year 2006.

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
