# **AN ACT**

- To authorize the Secretary of the Interior, acting through the Bureau of Reclamation to enter into a cooperative agreement with the Madera Irrigation District for purposes of supporting the Madera Water Supply Enhancement Project.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

#### 1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- This Act may be cited as the "Madera Water Supply
- 3 Enhancement Act".
- 4 SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.
- 5 (a) The term "District" means the Madera Irrigation
- 6 District, Madera, California.
- 7 (b) The term "Project" means the "Madera Water
- 8 Supply and Enhancement Project".
- 9 (c) The term "Secretary" means the Secretary of the
- 10 United States Department of the Interior.
- 11 SEC. 3. STUDY AND REPORT.
- 12 (a) Study.— Pursuant to the Reclamation Act of
- 13 1902 (32 Stat. 388) and Acts amendatory thereof and
- 14 supplemental thereto, the Secretary, acting through the
- 15 Commissioner of the Bureau of Reclamation, and in con-
- 16 sultation and cooperation with the District, is authorized
- 17 to conduct a study to determine the feasibility of con-
- 18 structing the Project.
- 19 (b) Report.—
- 20 (1) Transmission.—Upon completion of the
- 21 study authorized by subsection (a), the Secretary
- shall transmit to the Committee on Resources of the
- House of Representatives and the Committee on En-
- ergy and Natural Resources of the Senate a report
- containing the results of the study, together with

- recommendations regarding any recommendation to construct the project.
- 3 (2) USE OF AVAILABLE MATERIALS.—In devel-4 oping the report under this section, the Secretary 5 shall make use of reports and any other relevant in-6 formation supplied by the District.
- 7 (3) DEADLINE.—No later than December 30, 8 2006, the Secretary shall complete the report and 9 transmit the report to Congress pursuant to sub-10 section (b)(2).

# (c) Cost Share.—

- (1) Federal share.—The Federal share of the costs of the feasibility study authorized by this section shall not exceed 50 percent of the total cost of the study.
- 16 (2) IN-KIND CONTRIBUTION FOR NON-FEDERAL
  17 SHARE.—The Secretary may accept as part of the
  18 non-Federal cost share the contribution of such in19 kind services by the District as the Secretary deter20 mines will contribute to the conduct and completion
  21 of the study.

### 22 SEC. 4. COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT.

All planning, design, and construction of the Project authorized by this Act shall be undertaken in accordance with a cooperative agreement between the Secretary and

- 1 the District for the Project. Such cooperative agreement
- 2 shall set forth in a manner acceptable to the Secretary
- 3 and the District the responsibilities of the District for par-
- 4 ticipating in the study and related environmental review,
- 5 including, but not limited to:
- 6 (1) preparation of an assessment of the need
- 7 for the project;
- 8 (2) preparation of feasibility and reconnaissance
- 9 studies;
- 10 (3) environmental review;
- 11 (4) engineering and design;
- 12 (5) construction; and
- 13 (6) the administration of contracts pertaining
- to any of the foregoing.

## 15 SEC. 5. AUTHORIZATION FOR THE MADERA WATER SUPPLY

- 16 AND ENHANCEMENT PROJECT.
- 17 (a) AUTHORIZATION OF CONSTRUCTION.—Upon sub-
- 18 mission of feasibility report described in section 3 and a
- 19 statement by the Secretary that the project is feasible, the
- 20 Secretary, acting pursuant to the Federal reclamation
- 21 laws (Act of June 17, 1902; 32 Stat. 388), and Acts
- 22 amendatory thereof or supplementary thereto, as far as
- 23 those laws are not inconsistent with the provisions of this
- 24 Act, is authorized to enter into a cooperative agreement

- 1 through the Bureau with the District for the support of
- 2 the design, and construction of the Project.
- 3 (b) Cost Share.—The Federal share of the capital
- 4 costs of the Project shall not exceed 25 percent of the total
- 5 cost. Capital costs incurred by the District prior to the
- 6 date of the enactment of this Act shall be considered a
- 7 portion of the non-Federal cost share.
- 8 (c) In-Kind Services.—In-kind services performed
- 9 by the District shall be considered a part of the local cost
- 10 share to complete the Project authorized by subsection (a).
- 11 (d) Credit for Non-Federal Work.—The Dis-
- 12 trict shall receive credit toward the non-Federal share of
- 13 the cost of the Project for—
- 14 (1) reasonable costs incurred by the District as
- a result of participation in the planning, design, and
- 16 construction of the Project; and
- 17 (2) for the fair market value of lands used or
- acquired by the District for the Project.
- 19 (e) Limitation.—The Secretary shall not provide
- 20 funds for the operation or maintenance of the Project au-
- 21 thorized by this section. The operation and maintenance
- 22 of the Project shall be the sole responsibility of the Dis-
- 23 trict.
- 24 (f) Plans and Analyses Consistent With Fed-
- 25 ERAL LAW.—Before obligating funds for design or con-

- 1 struction under this section, the Secretary shall work co-
- 2 operatively with the District to use, to the extent possible,
- 3 plans, designs, and engineering and environmental anal-
- 4 yses that have already been prepared by the District for
- 5 the Project. The Secretary shall ensure that such informa-
- 6 tion as is used is consistent with applicable Federal laws
- 7 and regulations.
- 8 (g) Title; Responsibility; Liability.—Nothing in
- 9 this section or the assistance provided under this section
- 10 shall be construed to transfer title, responsibility or liabil-
- 11 ity related to the Project to the United States.
- 12 (h) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATION.—There is
- 13 authorized such sums as may be appropriated to carry out
- 14 this section.
- 15 SEC. 6. SUNSET.
- 16 The authority of the Secretary to carry out any provi-
- 17 sions of this Act shall terminate 10 years after the date
- 18 of the enactment of this Act.
