A BILL

To direct the Secretary of Homeland Security to establish the National Emergency Family Locator System.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "National Emergency
- 5 Family Locator Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.
- 7 In this Act:

1	(1) Department.—The term "Department"
2	means the Department of Homeland Security.
3	(2) Emergency.—The term "emergency" has
4	the meaning given the term in section 102 of the
5	Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency
6	Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 5122).
7	(3) Secretary.—The term "Secretary" means
8	the Secretary of Homeland Security.
9	(4) System.—The term "System" means the
10	National Emergency Family Locator System estab-
11	lished under section 3(a).
12	SEC. 3. NATIONAL EMERGENCY FAMILY LOCATOR SYSTEM.
13	(a) In General.—Not later than 180 days after the
14	date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall establish
15	within the Department the National Family Locator Sys-
16	tem.
17	(b) Purposes.—The purposes of the System are—
18	(1) to enable individuals displaced by an emer-
19	gency to provide to the Department the name and
20	location of the displaced individuals and any other
21	relevant information using the telephone, the Inter-
22	net, and other means determined to be appropriate
23	by the Secretary; and
24	(2) to enable the Department—

1	(A) to compile the information collected
2	under paragraph (1); and
3	(B) to provide the information collected
4	and compiled under the System to the family
5	members of the displaced individuals and law
6	enforcement officials.
7	(c) Considerations.—In establishing the System
8	under subsection (a), the Secretary shall take into account
9	and, to the maximum extent practicable, incorporate into
10	the System—
11	(1) intermediary-based locator systems such as
12	the National Next of Kin Registry; and
13	(2) information from existing family locator
14	databases, such as the Family News Network of the
15	International Committee of the Red Cross.
16	SEC. 4. FAMILY PREPAREDNESS PLAN PUBLIC OUTREACH
17	PROGRAM.
18	The Secretary, in consultation with the Secretary of
19	Education, shall conduct a public outreach program
20	through public school districts to educate families on how
21	to create a family preparedness plan for actions to take
22	in the event of a disaster in which family members are
23	separated.
