To permit statues honoring citizens of the District of Columbia to be placed in Statuary Hall in the same manner as statues honoring citizens of the States are placed in Statuary Hall, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. PLACEMENT OF STATUES OF CITIZENS OF DIS-**
4 **TRICT OF COLUMBIA IN STATUARY HALL.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 1814 of the Revised Stat-
6 utes of the United States (2 U.S.C. 2131) is amended by
7 adding at the end the following new sentence: “For pur-

1 poses of this section, the term ‘State’ shall include the Dis-
2 trict of Columbia.”.

3 (b) CONFORMING AMENDMENT REGARDING PROCE-
4 DURES FOR REPLACEMENT OF STATUES.—Section 311 of
5 the Legislative Branch Appropriations Act, 2001 (2
6 U.S.C. 2132), is amended by adding at the end the fol-
7 lowing new subsection:

8 “(f) For purposes of this section—

9 “(1) the term ‘State’ shall include the District
10 of Columbia; and

11 “(2) in the case of the District of Columbia, the
12 Council of the District of Columbia shall be treated
13 as the legislature and the Mayor of the District of
14 Columbia shall be treated as the Governor.”.
