## A BILL

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1	SECTION 1. INCLUSION OF EXCESS DEPARTMENT OF DE-
2	FENSE PROPERTY ON SANTA ROSA AND
3	OKALOOSA ISLAND IN GULF ISLANDS NA-
4	TIONAL SEASHORE.
5	Section 7 of Public Law 91–660 (16 U.S.C. 459h–
6	6) is amended—
7	(1) by inserting "(a)" before "There are"; and
8	(2) by adding at the end the following new sub-
9	section:
10	"(b) If any of the Federal land on Santa Rosa or
11	Okaloosa Island, Florida, under the jurisdiction of the De-
12	partment of Defense is ever excess to the needs of the
13	Armed Forces, the Secretary of Defense shall transfer,
14	without reimbursement, the excess land to the administra-
15	tive jurisdiction of the Secretary of the Interior. The Sec-
16	retary of the Interior shall administer the transferred land
17	as part of the seashore in accordance with the provisions
18	of this Act.".
