1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, 2 3 SECTION 1. REDUCTION IN PAY. 4 (a) IN GENERAL.—The rate of pay for each position referred to in paragraph (1) of section 601(a) of the Legislative Reorganization Act of 1946 (2 U.S.C. 31) shall— 6 7 (1) with respect to any service performed dur-8 ing the 110th Congress, be equal to the rate of pay 9 for such position as of December 31, 2006, reduced

1	(2) after the 110th Congress, be subject to ad-
2	justment to the same extent and in the same man-
3	ner as if the rate determined for such position under
4	paragraph (1) (after rounding in accordance with
5	subsection (b)) had been determined under such sec-
6	tion 601(a).

7 (b) ROUNDING RULE.—Any rate determined under 8 subsection (a)(1) shall be rounded to the nearest multiple 9 of \$100 (or, if midway between multiples of \$100, to the 10 next higher multiple of \$100).
