- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. CONGRESSIONAL FINDINGS.
- 4 Congress finds that—
- 5 (1) Dr. J.F. Boddie, the first and, for many
- 6 years, only African American physician in Baldwin
- 7 County, Georgia, was revered for the medical care he

- provided even the neediest African American families;
- 3 (2) Sallie Ellis Davis, a Georgia Woman of 4 Achievement, taught and inspired African American 5 children in Baldwin County during a celebrated ca-6 reer as an educator lasting more than 50 years; and
- 7 (3) Oscar Davis, Sr. and Clarence "Smokey" 8 Simmons made history in Baldwin County as the 9 first African Americans elected to the Board of 10 County Commissioners.

11 SEC. 2. BODDIE DAVIS SIMMONS POST OFFICE BUILDING.

- 12 (a) Designation.—The facility of the United States
- 13 Postal Service located at 118 East Hancock Street in
- 14 Milledgeville, Georgia, shall be known and designated as
- 15 the "Boddie Davis Simmons Post Office Building".
- 16 (b) References.—Any reference in a law, map, reg-
- 17 ulation, document, paper, or other record of the United
- 18 States to the facility referred to in subsection (a) shall
- 19 be deemed to be a reference to the "Boddie Davis Sim-
- 20 mons Post Office Building".
