A BILL

To prohibit Federal payments to any individual, business, institution, or organization that engages in human cloning.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Human Cloning Pre-
- 5 vention Act of 2005".
- 6 SEC. 2. PROHIBITION.
- 7 (a) General Rule.—Except as provided in sub-
- 8 section (b), no Federal agency shall—
- 9 (1) make any grant, contract, or other pay-
- ment; or

- 1 (2) enter into any obligation for making any
- 2 such grant, contract, or payment,
- 3 to any individual, business, institution, or organization
- 4 that within the past 1 year has engaged in human cloning,
- 5 or to any individual, business, institution, or organization
- 6 that controls, is controlled by, or is under common control
- 7 with any individual, business, institution, or organization
- 8 that within the past 1 year has engaged in human cloning.
- 9 (b) Exception.—Subsection (a)(1) shall not apply
- 10 to any payment a Federal agency is obligated to make.

11 SEC. 3. DEFINITION.

- For purposes of this Act, the term "human cloning"
- 13 means human asexual reproduction, accomplished by in-
- 14 troducing nuclear material from one or more human so-
- 15 matic cells into a fertilized or unfertilized oocyte whose
- 16 nuclear material has been removed or inactivated so as
- 17 to produce a living organism (at any stage of development)
- 18 that is genetically identical to an existing or previously ex-
- 19 isting human organism.
