A BILL

To amend the Immigration and Nationality Act to increase the period of authorized stay under the Guam visa waiver program to be the same as the period of authorized stay under the United States visa waiver program.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. INCREASE IN PERIOD OF AUTHORIZED STAY**
4 **UNDER GUAM VISA WAIVER PROGRAM.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 212(l)(1) of the Immigra-
6 tion and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1182(l)(1)), and the
7 second sentence of section 214(a)(1) of such Act (8 U.S.C.

1 1184(a)(1)), are each amended by striking “fifteen days”
2 and inserting “90 days”.

3 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by
4 subsection (a) shall apply to aliens admitted to Guam
5 without a visa under section 212(l) of the Immigration
6 and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1182(l)) on or after the
7 date that is 180 days after the date of the enactment of
8 this Act.
