## A BILL

To require the Consumer Product Safety Commission to issue safety standards for lead-containing dishware.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SAFETY STANDARDS FOR LEAD-CONTAINING
- 4 DISHWARE.
- 5 Not later than 180 days after the date of the enact-
- 6 ment of this Act, the Consumer Product Safety Commis-
- 7 sion shall issue consumer product safety standards, pursu-
- 8 ant to section 7 of the Consumer Product Safety Act (15
- 9 U.S.C. 2056), for glassware, dishware, and any other
- 10 cooking utensil, drinking utensil, or eating utensil con-

- 1 taining lead. Such standard shall determine the amount
- 2 of lead in such products that shall be considered haz-
- 3 ardous and may require labeling of such products or de-
- 4 clare products containing an unacceptable amount of lead,
- 5 as determined by the Commission, to be banned hazardous
- 6 products under section 8 of such Act (15 U.S.C. 2057).
