## A BILL

To direct the Consumer Product Safety Commission to strengthen regulations concerning the flammability of children's clothing.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. FLAMMABILITY OF CHILDREN'S CLOTHING.
- 4 (a) STANDARDS FOR CLOTHING WORN BY CHILDREN
- 5 Under Age 15.—Not later than 180 days after the date
- 6 of enactment of this Act, the Consumer Product Safety
- 7 Commission shall revise parts 1615 and 1616 of title 16,
- 8 Code of Federal Regulations (relating to the flammability
- 9 of children's sleepwear) to include all clothing worn by
- 10 children under the age of 15.

- 1 (b) Scientific Basis for Testing Standards;
- 2 Consultation With Experts.—The Commission shall
- 3 also substantially strengthen the standards for tests used
- 4 to determine the flammability of such clothing to ensure
- 5 that such standards are grounded on a firm scientific
- 6 basis. In revising such testing standards, the Commission
- 7 shall consult with experts on skin burns, clothing flamma-
- 8 bility, and pediatric social behavior, as well as experts
- 9 from the National Institutes of Science and Technology,
- 10 the National Fire Protection Association, and the Amer-
- 11 ican Society for Testing and Materials.
