A BILL

To provide for an automatic one-year extension of the authorizations of appropriations and direct spending programs of the Farm Security and Rural Investment Act of 2002 and to provide for an additional one-year extension if implementing legislation is not submitted with respect to the Doha Development Round of World Trade Organization negotiations by January 15, 2008, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. EXTENSION OF FARM SECURITY AND RURAL**
2 **INVESTMENT ACT OF 2002.**

3 (a) CROP PROGRAMS.—

4 (1) AUTOMATIC ONE-YEAR EXTENSION.—Every
5 reference in title I of the Farm Security and Rural
6 Investment Act of 2002 (Public Law 107–171; 7
7 U.S.C. 7901 et seq.), or in an amendment made by
8 such title, to the 2007 crop year or the 2007 crop
9 of a commodity shall be deemed to also cover the
10 2008 crop year and the 2008 crop of the same com-
11 modity. In the case of sections 1204(e)(1) and
12 1208(a) of such Act (7 U.S.C. 7934(e)(1), 7938(a)),
13 the references to July 31, 2008, shall be deemed to
14 be July 31, 2009.

15 (2) CONDITIONAL ADDITIONAL YEAR EXTEN-
16 SION.—If the President does not submit to Congress
17 implementing legislation with respect to the Doha
18 Development Round of World Trade Organization
19 negotiations by January 15, 2008—

20 (A) every reference in title I of the Farm
21 Security and Rural Investment Act of 2002, or
22 in an amendment made by such title, that is
23 deemed to cover the 2008 crop year or the 2008
24 crop of a commodity, by operation of paragraph
25 (1), shall be deemed to instead cover the 2008

1 and 2009 crop years and the 2008 and 2009
2 crops of the same commodity; and

3 (B) the references to July 31, 2008, in
4 sections 1204(e)(1) and 1208(a) of such Act
5 shall be deemed to be July 31, 2010.

6 (b) OTHER DIRECT SPENDING PROGRAMS AND AU-
7 THORITIES.—

8 (1) AUTOMATIC ONE-YEAR EXTENSION.—For
9 purposes of every direct spending program (as de-
10 fined in section 250(c)(8) of the Balanced Budget
11 and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985 (2
12 U.S.C. 900(c)(8))) or other authority established or
13 amended by the Farm Security and Rural Invest-
14 ment Act of 2002 (Public Law 107–171), other than
15 crop programs covered by subsection (a), every ref-
16 erence to 2007 with regard to such programs or au-
17 thority shall be deemed to refer instead to 2008.
18 The funding level, acreage level, or tonnage level (as
19 the case may be) specified for such a program or au-
20 thority in such Act, or in an amendment made by
21 such Act, for fiscal year 2007 shall also apply for
22 fiscal year 2008.

23 (2) CONDITIONAL ADDITIONAL YEAR EXTEN-
24 SION.—If the President does not submit to Congress
25 implementing legislation with respect to the Doha

2 negotiations by January 15, 2008—

3 (A) every reference in a direct spending
4 program or other authority established or
5 amended by the Farm Security and Rural In-
6 vestment Act of 2002 that is deemed to be
7 2008 rather than 2007, by operation of para-
8 graph (1), shall be deemed to instead refer to
9 2009; and

10 (B) the funding level, acreage level, or ton-
11 nage level (as the case may be) for fiscal year
12 2007 for such a program or authority shall
13 apply for both fiscal years 2008 and 2009.

14 (c) EXTENSION OF AUTHORIZATIONS OF APPROPRIA-
15 TIONS AND PROGRAM TERMINATIONS.—

16 (1) AUTOMATIC ONE-YEAR EXTENSION.—Every
17 authorization of appropriations contained in the
18 Farm Security and Rural Investment Act of 2002
19 (Public Law 107–171), or in an amendment made
20 by such Act, that would otherwise expire on Sep-
21 tember 30, 2007, shall be deemed to expire on Sep-
22 tember 30, 2008. Every reference in such Act or in
23 an amendment made by such Act to the termination
24 of a program or authority in 2007 shall be deemed
25 to refer instead to 2008.

1 (2) CONDITIONAL ADDITIONAL YEAR EXTEN-
2 SION.—If the President does not submit to Congress
3 implementing legislation with respect to the Doha
4 Development Round of World Trade Organization
5 negotiations by January 15, 2008—

6 (A) every authorization of appropriations
7 contained in the Farm Security and Rural In-
8 vestment Act of 2002, or in an amendment
9 made by such Act, that is deemed to expire on
10 September 30, 2008, by operation of paragraph
11 (1), shall be deemed to expire on September 30,
12 2009; and

13 (B) every reference to the termination of a
14 program or authority specified in such Act, or
15 in an amendment made by such Act, that is
16 deemed to occur in 2008 rather than 2007, by
17 operation of paragraph (1), shall be deemed to
18 occur instead in 2009.

19 (d) EXCEPTION.—This section does not apply with
20 respect to peanut storage costs under section 1307(a)(6)
21 of the Farm Security and Rural Investment Act of 2002
22 (7 U.S.C. 7957(a)(6)).
