## A BILL

To amend section 1111 of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 regarding challenging academic content standards for physical education.

4 Congress makes the following findings:
Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, SECTION 1. FINDINGS.
(1) Obesity-related diseases cost the United States economy more than $\$ 100,000,000,000$ every year.
(2) Almost half of young people aged 12 through 21, and more than a third of high school
students, do not participate in vigorous physical activity on a regular basis.

## SEC. 2. PHYSICAL EDUCATION.

Section 1111(b) of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 6311(b)) is amended-
(1) in paragraph (1)(C)—
(A) by striking "arts, and" and inserting "arts,"; and
(B) by striking "science," and inserting "science, and (beginning in the 2006-2007 school year) physical education,"; and
(2) in paragraph (3)-
(A) in subparagraph (A)-
(i) by striking "and science" and inserting "science, and physical education"; and
(ii) by inserting before the period "and no State shall be required to meet the requirements of this part relating to physical education assessments until the beginning of the 2008-2009 school year'; and
(B) in subparagraph (C)(v)—
(i) in subclause (II)(cc), by inserting "and" after the semicolon; and
(ii) by adding at the end the following:
"(III) beginning not later than school year 2008-2009, measure the proficiency of all students in physical education and be administered not less than 1 time during"(aa) grades 3 through 5;
"(bb) grades 6 through 9; and
"(cc) grades 10 through 12;".
