A BILL

- To authorize the President to provide disaster assistance for the repair, restoration, reconstruction, or replacement of a privately-owned power transmission facility damaged or destroyed by Hurricane Katrina or Hurricane Rita.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1SECTION 1. DISASTER ASSISTANCE FOR PRIVATELY-2OWNED POWER TRANSMISSION FACILITIES3DAMAGED OR DESTROYED BY HURRICANE4KATRINA OR HURRICANE RITA.

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Subject to the requirements of this section, the President may make contributions under 6 7 section 406 of the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and 8 Emergency Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 5172) to a person 9 that owns or operates a power transmission facility for the 10 costs of repair, restoration, reconstruction, or replacement 11 of those portions of the facility damaged or destroyed by Hurricane Katrina or Hurricane Rita and associated ex-12 13 penses incurred by such person.

(b) ELIGIBILITY FOR CONTRIBUTIONS.—A person
that owns or operates a power transmission facility shall
be eligible for contributions under this section if—

(1) as a result of Hurricane Katrina or Hurricane Rita the facility suffered an outage during
which the facility was not able to provide service to
more than 25 percent of the customers of the facility
or was not able to provide service over more than 25
percent of the transmission miles of the facility; and

(2) the total of the costs of repair, restoration,
reconstruction, and replacement of all power transmission facilities owned or operated by such person
that were damaged or destroyed by Hurricane
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Katrina and Hurricane Rita and associated expenses
 exceed \$50,000,000.

3 (c) LIMITATIONS ON CONTRIBUTIONS.—Repair, res-4 toration, reconstruction, and replacement costs of a person 5 that owns or operates one or more power transmission facilities and associated expenses shall be eligible for con-6 7 tributions under subsection (a) only to the extent that the 8 total of such costs and expenses exceed \$50,000,000 and 9 such person does not receive funds from an insurer for 10 such costs and expenses.

11 (d) FEDERAL SHARE.—The President shall credit to-12 ward the non-Federal share of the costs of repair, restora-13 tion, reconstruction, or replacement of a power transmission facility and associated expenses under this section 14 15 all amounts incurred in connection with such costs and expenses by the person that owns or operates the facility, 16 17 including the first \$50,000,000 of such costs and ex-18 penses.

(e) POWER TRANSMISSION FACILITY DEFINED.—In
this section, the term "power transmission facility" means
a privately-owned electric transmission or distribution facility obligated under State law to provide electricity service to retail customers and a privately-owned natural gas
transmission or distribution facility. Such term includes
leased facilities.

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(f) APPROVAL OR DISAPPROVAL OF APPLICATIONS.—
 The President shall approve or disapprove an application
 for assistance submitted by a person under this section
 not later than 30 days after the date of receipt of the ap plication.

6 (g) FUNDING.—Amounts appropriated for providing 7 disaster relief under the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Re-8 lief and Emergency Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 5121 et 9 seq.) shall be available to carry out this section, including 10 amounts appropriated before the date of enactment of this 11 Act.

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
